

Proposed Visitor Parking Pass (VPP) Program for ANC 2F

This plan will be considered by the ANC 2F Community Development Committee (CDC) on Wednesday, March 26th at 7:00 p.m. at the Washington Plaza Hotel. If approved by the CDC, the proposal will be considered by the full ANC on Thursday, April 10 at 7:00 p.m. at the Washington Plaza Hotel.

Basics:

- DDOT would update their VPP database to include the address of households that are eligible to receive Residential Permit Parking (RPP) within the boundaries of ANC 2F.
 - In order for a household to be eligible for RPP, the street where the address is located must be zoned for RPP as indicated by a two-hour residential restriction sign on your block.
 - There are a number of blocks in ANC 2F that have not been established for residential parking, thus addresses on these blocks would not be eligible for a VPP.
- Eligible residents of ANC2F would be invited to register for a VPP through an online service provided by DDOT. This service allows DDOT to track who requests a pass and where it will be sent.
- Only one VPP may be issued per household. The VPP system checks against the Master Address Repository (MAR) to verify household designation and eligibility.
- An issued VPP is linked to both the eligible address and the requestor. Each pass has a unique address identifier printed on the pass.
- The pass may not be issued to businesses or churches that operate within households.
- The electronic VPP system has been in use since January 2014 and is administered by DDOT staff who process the requests, verify the validity and eligibility of the addresses, and approve or deny requests.

Obtaining a Pass:

- Each request for a VPP through the online system will generate an individual record that will be vetted for eligibility by DDOT staff.
- Requesting residents will receive an automated response from the system with a confirmation number that will allow the resident to track the status of their request.
- Once approved the registration will be mailed to the submitted address.
- 7-10 business days are needed to complete the process from registration to delivery.

Use of a Pass

- The VPP program is designed to allow guests of District residents to park for more than two hours on RPP zoned blocks.
- A VPP is only valid during the hours of RPP enforcement and in the same RPP zone and ANC boundary as the residence.
- District residents cannot use a VPP in lieu of registering their vehicles with the District Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV). If residents who receive a pass have guests that stay overnight frequently, then the visitor should register their vehicle through the Registration of Out of State Automobile (ROSA) program once a warning citation is issued by DPW parking enforcement personnel.
